


**The Most Holy Body And Blood Of Christ
(Corpus Christi)
June 14, 2020**

If we're fortunate, we spend some time each day together with our loved one. It may be with just one other person; it might be with a large family. We may often eat together with coworkers or friends or even neighbors. But the Eucharist is probably the one occasion at which we regularly eat with everyone: family and friends, neighbors and strangers. No matter how large or how diverse the gathering is, one thing is true: we never eat alone. We eat as one of many, as the body of Christ.

We consume the Body of Christ as part of the Body of Christ. The Body of Christ is both the congregation who gathers to celebrate the Eucharist, the Church, as well as the Eucharist itself. As Saint Paul says in the second reading, the bread we break and the wine we bless are a participation in the body and blood of Christ. Nourished by the Body of Christ (the Eucharist) the Body of Christ (the Church) becomes the Body of Christ in the world, participating in the mission of Christ Jesus, witnessing to the gospel in our daily lives.

Today's passage from Deuteronomy refers to the water that came forth from the rock, which quenched the Chosen People's thirst in the desert. Rabbinic legend spoke of a miraculous spring that followed the Israelites, proving its life-giving water through the forty years they wandered. Earlier in his letter to the Corinthians, Paul combines these images when he writes, "they drank from a spiritual rock that followed them, and the rock was the Christ" (10:4). Jesus is that continual source of life who is always near, always available, always nourishing us. Jesus told the crowd that whoever eats his body and drinks his blood has life within and indeed will live forever. With Jesus within us, we have the source and the destination of life within us and always will.

General Guidelines for Mass Attendance:

Please enter the door in the front to check in.
Please wear a mask during Mass aside from receiving Communion.

Every other pew in the Church will be roped off.

Be mindful of social distancing and maintain six feet of distance from others at all times.

The sign of peace may be expressed by means of a smile and/or a nod of the head. No physical sign of peace will be exchanged.

When Mass is over, please do not gather in groups in the Narthex and continue to maintain social distancing.

Guidelines for Receiving Holy Communion:

Please bring hand sanitizer to use before receiving Communion.

During Communion, please maintain social distancing in the line by spacing out six feet from the person in front of you.

Communion will be distributed by means of the sacred Host only.

Out of consideration and concern for others, we ask everyone to receive Communion in the hand rather than on the tongue.

When approaching the priest for Communion, place your hand flat atop your other hand. The priest will place the Host over your hand and then let go of the Host to avoid any contact with your hand.
